

DEAR PARENT: Your household is eligible to save up to \$30 off your monthly internet bill through a new U.S. government program.

The Affordable Connectivity Program provides up to \$30 off your monthly internet bill.

High-speed internet is a necessity – especially for students. That’s why the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law created the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) to lower internet costs. ACP provides:

- Up to \$30/month off your household’s internet bills (or up to \$75/month on Tribal lands), and
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 off a laptop, tablet, or desktop computer.

Many internet service providers across the country offer high-speed internet plans that are fully covered by ACP – so millions of households can now get high-speed internet without paying a dime.

Your household is automatically eligible because your child’s entire school qualifies.

A household is eligible to participate in the ACP if a child in the household receives free or reduced price school meals. Your household is automatically eligible for the ACP because your student attends a school that provides meals at no cost to all children through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) of the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program.

How do I enroll?

- **Step 1:** Get ready to apply. To complete your ACP application, you will need a letter or other official documentation from the CEP school stating that the student is enrolled at a CEP-participating school. That documentation must also include the student’s name, the relevant school year, the name and address of the school, and school contact information (phone or email).
- **Step 2:** Claim your ACP benefit by visiting [GetInternet.gov](https://www.getinternet.gov) to submit an ACP application or to print out a mail-in ACP application, contact a participating internet service provider, or call 877-384-2575 to learn more.
- **Step 3:** Contact a participating internet service provider to choose an internet plan. Listed below are providers that offer plans that are fully covered with the ACP benefit; for a full list of providers, visit <https://www.fcc.gov/affordable-connectivity-program-providers>; while these providers accept the ACP benefits, households may still be responsible to pay the difference between the plan cost and the ACP benefit.
