Redbank Valley School District Gifted Identification Process

Pennsylvania Department of Education Definitions:

- Gifted student: (i) A student who is exceptional under section 1371 of the School Code(24 P. S. § 3-1371) because the student meets the definition of 'mentally gifted' in this section, and needs specially designed instruction beyond that required in Chapter 4 (relating to academic standards and assessment)
- Mentally Gifted: Outstanding intellectual and creative ability the development of which requires specially designed programs or support services, or both, not ordinarily provided in the regular education program.
- Gifted Individualized Education Plan: The Gifted Individualized Education Plan (GIEP) is the framework of a student's program and should consist of information that is useful in providing appropriate programming and support services. The GIEP is a yearly summary document that includes all curricular areas in which a gifted child is to receive an education that is adapted and modified to provide opportunities to participate in acceleration or enrichment, or both, as appropriate for the student's individual needs.

Screening and Evaluation:

- Universal Screening: The Redbank Valley School District utilizes the Otis-Lennon School Ability Test (OLSAT) as a universal screener given to all students at the end of the 2nd grade school year. The OLSAT is a multiple-choice K-12 assessment that measures reasoning skills with several different types of verbal, non-verbal, figural and quantitative reasoning questions. Universal screening is an identification practice where all students in a targeted grade level are administered a universal screening assessment. Students scoring at or above a score of 132; top 1-3%, and/or above the 97th percentile on the OLSAT are referred to the school psychologist to be evaluated for determination of qualification for gifted services.
- Referral: Guardians and/or teachers refer student(s) to be screened for possible gifted abilities. The Redbank Valley School District utilizes the Kaufman Brief Intelligence Test Second Edition (KBIT-2), to screen student(s) that are recommended through the referral process. The KBIT-2 is a screening assessment, individually administered to measure verbal and nonverbal intelligence. Students scoring at or above a score of 125 on the KBIT-2 are referred to the school psychologist to be evaluated for determination for qualification for gifted services.

Parent Request: Parents may choose to bypass the screening process through a parent request for a multidisciplinary evaluation to determine if their child is exceptional and in need of special services by contacting the director of special populations.

120 - 125	Three of the following criteria: □ Advanced scores on state standardized assessments in the areas of English Language Arts or Math for two consecutive years. □ Scores above 120 in Reading and/or Math on a nationally-normed assessment. □ Curriculum Based Measurements demonstrate that the student is achieving at two years above age assigned grade level standards (above benchmark and/or advanced). □ Student achieves 93% or higher in the areas of Reading and Math on the Redbank Valley School District approved grade report card.
119 or below	All four of the following criteria: □ Advanced scores on state standardized assessments in the areas of English Language Arts or Math for two consecutive years. □ Scores above 120 in Reading and/or Math on a nationally-normed assessment. □ Curriculum Based Measurements demonstrate that the student is achieving at two years above age assigned grade level standards (above benchmark and/or advanced). □ Student achieves 93% or higher in the areas of Reading and Math on the Redbank Valley School District approved grade report card.
